

This fact sheet provides a summary of the latest tourism data for the Backpacker segment. Information includes: domestic and international visitor numbers, and visitor profiles such as origin, purpose of visit, travel party and activities.

DOMESTIC & INTERNATIONAL VISITATION FOR BACKPACKERS

Backpacker tourism visitors are defined as those who stayed at least one night in a backpackers or hostel while on their trip to Australia.

NB: International backpacker tourism visitors to Victoria as defined above, did not indicate in which state the activities were undertaken while on their trip to Australia. Figure will differ from trend data below.

International Visitation

570,000 international backpacker tourism visitors travelled to Australia in the year ending December 2009, accounting for 43.8 million nights. Of these visitors, 45% visited Victoria during this period.

259,000 backpacker tourism visitors to Australia travelled to Victoria on their trip in the year ending December 2009, accounting for 6.7 million nights. Backpacker tourism visitors represent 17% of all international visitors to the State.

Average length of stay for backpacker tourism visitors to Australia was 76.8 nights, compared to an average length of stay of 25.8 nights for backpacker tourism visitors to Victoria.

In 2009, approximately 178,000 international visitors to Victoria stayed overnight in a backpackers/hostel in Victoria. These visitors accounted for an estimated 6.7 million nights to Victoria in the period (any accommodation type).

More specifically, backpackers account for 2.1 million nights in backpacker/hostel accommodation in Victoria.

Since 1999, the total nights by backpackers (any accommodation type) has increased by 7.9% per annum and nights in backpackers/hostels has increased by 7.6% per annum.

Over time, international backpacker visitors to Australia have grown at an average annual rate of 3.4% since 1999. International visitor nights also increased at 5.2% per annum over this period.

Compared to 2008, international backpacker visitors to Australia have increased by 1.9% for visitors and have increased 7.5% for visitor nights.

Since 1999, international visitors who stayed overnight in backpacker accommodation or a hostel in Victoria have grown at an average annual rate of 4.7% and grew over the last year by 1.8%.

Victoria's market share of International backpacker tourism visitors is estimated to be 31.2% in the year 2009.

Domestic Overnight Visitation

Australia received 451,000 domestic overnight backpackers for the year ending December 2009, accounting for 1.8 million visitor nights. The average length of stay was 3.9 nights.

During the same period Victoria received 142,000 domestic overnight backpackers.

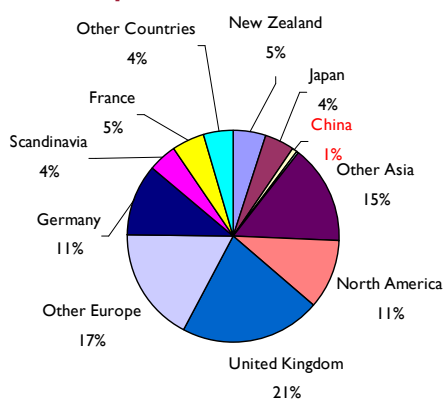
There was a 59.6% increase of domestic backpackers to and within Victoria from 2008 to 2009. Australia also experienced an increase with 5.9% year-on-year. Domestic backpacker nights in Australia decreased by 3.3% over the same period.

Between 1999 and 2009, domestic backpacker visitation to Australia has grown by an average of 2.7% per annum. However, there was an average annual decrease of 3.6% in visitor nights spent in the country by these visitors over the same period.

PROFILE OF INTERNATIONAL BACKPACKERS

The analysis following examines those who are backpacker tourism visitors who stayed at least one night in a backpackers or hostel while visiting Victoria. Due to survey limitations, data for Victoria is based on three years of data to December 2009, unless stated otherwise.

Origin of Backpackers to Victoria



The largest source market of backpacker tourism visitors to Victoria was the United Kingdom with 21% or an estimated 34,200 visitors in 2009. Other important markets include Europe (est. 73,300), Other Asia (est. 26,500) and North America (est. 20,400).

Age Group (% of International Backpackers)

International backpackers to Victoria were most likely to be aged between 15-24 years old (48%) or 25-44 years (46%).
